## **CHRIST THE REDEEMER**

#### Jeremiah 33:14-16 & Luke 21:25-36

In our Bible readings today, we are

warned to be prepared. Christianity acknowledges that in God's appointed time, Christ will return himself as he brings creation to its fulfilment. While the world awaits this climactic and wonderful time, people are left waiting, anticipating, wondering about the future. During this past couple of years throughout the effects of Corona on the world, I too, have wondered what the future holds for us. I have had conversations with friends, wondering if we will ever return to the world we knew just at the beginning of last year. As a Christian, I hold to God's promise of salvation, but it hasn't stopped me wondering, worrying about what might transpire in the meantime.
