Ladies Bible Study



Message from Gail

Over the next three Sundays I will be presenting a sermon series based on my last subject for my Batchelor of Theology degree. I chose to do an independent research topic and my paper was entitled *Words* of Hope for Aging and Declining Congregations.

During the week a reader of the UCA's Insights magazine reached out to me after reading the article in which myself and my fellow exit colleagues were interviewed. Keen to know more about my research paper and its findings he called me on the phone and asked, "So, have you got the answer". I laughed and said, "if only it were that easy".

In researching the way both society and the church has changed over the last fifty or so years I think I discovered more questions than answers, however I have developed a passion for seeing congregations grow in spiritual maturity and in the understanding and practice of missional outreach and evangelism. If we grow in both these areas will the number of people attending church on a Sunday morning also grow? Again I am not sure it is that simple.

As I think about ways to journey with you all towards spiritual maturity and missional growth I have two competing trains of thought. At times they intersect but one is far more important than the other.

One train is destined for growth in numbers so that the church can go on after we have gone. It sees decline as failure and it wants everything to stay the same. It keeps circling back to the "good old days' when the Sunday School was overflowing and the church full to the brim.

The other train is focused on the church being the body of Christ, it doesn't let numbers, whether they be age or church attendance slow it down or derail it.

It understands that the Church's call is "to be a fellowship of reconciliation, a body within which the diverse gifts of its members are used for the building of the whole, an instrument through which Christ may work and bear witness to himself" (Basis of Union: paragraph 3).
