Gail's Message

During Uniting in Prayer, which spans the twenty-six days between Pentecost and the anniversary of the Uniting Church on 22nd June we have been asked to pray for the Henty-Culcairn congregations and the Stillpoint Faith Community. Last week I wrote about the Henty -Culcairn cluster, this week I am providing some details about our sisters and brothers in the faith living in Wayville, South Australia. I am hoping to connect with them over the next week so that we can pray for all the good things God has done for them and also pray for any issues that cause them concern.

Firstly, many of you may be wondering about the difference between a Uniting Church Congregation and a Faith Community. In general a faith community does not have the capacity to maintain a Church Council, a Minister/Deacon, or manage any finances. Faith communities however can still be vital centres of God's presence providing spiritual support and guidance. This week I googled Stillpoint Faith Community and they describe their mission in the following way:

"We are a small contemplative community with an accent on providing a beautiful space in which you can find healing and hope, while you explore the love of God in an inclusive, respectful and non-judgemental way. We are a community connecting with others and the wider church. We offer a diverse range of spiritual opportunities including musical therapy, meditation during worship, fortnightly newsletter, library, pastoral care, spiritual direction, specialty programs on spirituality in aging, Stories from the Soul resource, Taste and See Contemplative Prayer, and Mindful Movement & Meditation.

Stillpoint is a resource centre for the promotion of spirituality and mysticism. It operates within the Mission and Resourcing sector of the Uniting Church Synod in South Australia. The centre offers resources and opportunities to exercise body, mind and soul, while creating a space of beauty, which nurtures human wellbeing and flourishing.

We are located at the delightful Christ Church Uniting Church, 26 King William Road, Wayville."
