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Don't bury your talents!

This week we will hear and think about Jesus' Parable of the Talents, a story in which three servants are given a certain number of talents; a talent was currency, considered to have been worth anywhere from \$1000 to 30,000 dollars in today's money. While the master was away there was an expectation that the talents would be used as investment capital. Two servants did this well and are commended, the third servants buried his talent and is condemned.

In my sermon I will ask questions of this parable rather than providing answers or employing the parable as a call to the church to do more and be more. I believe that we should never be manipulated or induced into using our gifts because we fear God's condemnation, rather our giftedness should flow out of us naturally as a response to God's love and grace; it should stem from our passions and interests, and we should feel restless until we find a way to express our God given gifts.

John Ortberg, an American evangelical Christian author, speaker, and Pastor, describes burying our talents in the following dark description of a life,

You can drift, get up, go to work, come home, eat supper, watch TV, retire, and die OR you can take each moment and say, "God, this is yours." You can offer him your spiritual giftedness (not compared with anyone else) as fully realised and developed as you can get it, that is life, a life celebrated with joy, sacrifice, and vitality".

If you are wondering about your own approach to life and the gifts God has given you, here is a question to ponder. Take some time to imagine a scene where you and God review your life together. What single step could you take today to most minimize the regret factor at the end of your life? Yes, taking our gifts out of the box and using them is risky but the spiritual gift God gives to each of us is too precious not to be used. It has been said that there is no tragedy like the tragedy of the unopened gift. The good news is that our Lord, the Lord of the Gift, promises to be with us every step of the way, through the highs, the lows, the failures, and the victories. So don't be afraid. Through our spiritual gifts and talents may God be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ.

I hope this brief reflection on our God given giftedness has sparked some interest because there are many ways to assess and discern our individual giftedness and many ways to name and classify the gifts that God has bestowed upon the Church. This is an area of church life and growth we can spend some time looking at next year as a companion to seeking God's will for Greystanes Uniting in a Visioning service. Stay tuned!
