## Jesus: the Lamb like Lion and Lion like Lamb.

<sup>11</sup> Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, <sup>12</sup> singing with full voice,

"Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered

to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might

and honour and glory and blessing!"

<sup>13</sup> Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, singing,

"To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb

be blessing and honour and glory and might

forever and ever!"

Above is an amazing revelation from John of Patmos. Imagine beholding billions of living creatures praising the One who is alone worthy. John describes Jesus Christ as the Lamb that was slain. This is a very unusual image for a victorious, glorious king, someone who is receiving praise from every single creature. So what is going on here?

At the beginning of this Revelation 5 John describes Jesus as the Lion of Judah, harking back to the gospel account of Jesus being a direct descendent of the Tribe of Judah. The Lion of Judah sounds much more king-like, proud, fierce, courageous and powerful power, but a tiny lamb? At first glance this makes no sense. In Revelation, John describes Jesus as two things at the same time, both Lion and Lamb. William Loader describes this scene as "an extraordinary violation of the norms of power and dignity".<sup>1</sup> Our Lord Jesus, turns the ways of the world and its assumptions upside down.

With that in mind, who do you see as powerful in the world today? Do they also have lamb-like qualities, gentleness, purity, meekness and humility? A Jesus like leader is a rare thing indeed! May those who exercise political power over this nation, also bear the wisdom, grace and compassion of our Servant King, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**
