Discerning God's Will

During the month of September we have all been praying daily for God's will to be made known to us regarding our church, its future, its property and its capital. Discerning God's will is not easy, its requires a lot of trust and patience and I want to encourage all of you to continue praying for our church daily because the power of prayer is a mighty thing. Jesus tells us that whatever we ask for in prayer, we must believe we have received. In doing this our prayers are answered (Mark 11:24). James the Apostle tells us that the prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective (James 5:16) and in Hebrews we hear this prayer of praise:

Now to him (Christ) who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us. (Ephesians 3:20).

I need to digress here and highlight that, yes, our prayers are answered but we do not always receive what we wanted, instead God always acts according to God's great plan and purpose for our individual lives and the for the sake of the entire world. God sees the bigger picture or as someone wise once was explained, we see the messy side of the universal tapestry with all its loose threads and it often makes no sense. God sees both sides, one is a testament to the trials and hard work of the making, the other is made, complete, perfect and beautiful beyond compare.

The Uniting Church offers anyone seeking God's will for their lives, a time set aside, known as a Period of Discernment, or POD for short. During this time, which can be anything from six months to several years, a mentee meets with a mentor to consider many things, however I believe the most important factor is learning about our own heart, gifts and passions. If we apply this to the task before as Greystanes Uniting Church, we need to think about who we are as a collective. Think of our church as one living body (which we are see 1 Corinthians 10:17) and see if you can describe our personality. Are we friendly, are we snobbish, are we fun, are we very serious, prim and proper?

Then we move to what we have to offer, our gifts our talents and our capital assets. We consider the practical things. Lastly we consider our passions. As a church are we committed to spreading the good news, are we committed to welcoming people into the church family, are we passionate about climate change, justice for all people, homes for the homeless etc.

Sometime before Christmas we will have the opportunity to know more about ourselves as Greystanes Uniting Church when we receive feedback from David Toogood who has coached the Ministry Team in what it takes to Grow Young. I will also present to you in a series of services some of the work your church leaders undertook when we meet with Geoff Stevenson, our Presbytery Mission Strategist. In the meantime remember to continue praying for God's will to be done as we move forward into 2026.
