
Thursday 25th December: 9am as usual. A morning of worship, fun and celebration.

Advent 3 Christmas Bowl Reflection on Isaiah 35:1-10

³ Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way;
⁴ say to those with fearful hearts, "Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to save you."
They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads.
Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away. (Isaiah 35:3-4, 10b NIV)

Isaiah speaks of a joy that is transformative, restoring what has been lost and opening paths that once seemed impossible. "The tongue of the mute sing for joy" reminds us that God's joy comes to those who have known hardship, sorrow, or limitation, bringing new life and hope.

In Central Sulawesi, Indonesia, Eko*, his wife Mega*, and their daughter Dewi* had faced repeated floods that destroyed crops and threatened their entire way of life. Life as a farmer was unpredictable and exhausting and hope often felt fragile. But through the Christmas Bowl and Act for Peace's local partner, Yayasan Cita Wadah Swadaya (YCWS), Eko and Mega joined the DREAM program, learning sustainable farming techniques, adapting to climate change, and building resilience for the future.

The challenges remain, but they are no longer powerless; they are learning, adapting, and thriving. Isaiah's vision is coming to life here: joy rising in the midst of hardship, resilience replacing despair, and new life flourishing where once there was loss.

Through the Christmas Bowl, we join God's work of restoring joy, supporting communities like Eko's to flourish, grow, and experience the deep, sustaining joy that comes from hope, empowerment, and God's presence.
